- Providing healthy snacks to an afterschool program for children living in poverty in rural Kentucky
- Supplying books for an international scholarship recipient in the Philippines
- Purchasing baby chicks to create entrepreneurship opportunities for women and youth in Mozambique

Growing Food, Growing Community, Growing with Purpose"

In 2016, Muskingum Soil & Water Conservation District (SWCD) was awarded a \$50,000 grant through the National Association of Corporate Directors (NACD)'s Urban Agriculture Conservation Grant Initiative, which helped establish the Urban Greens program. Initially, the program began with three community gardens in the Putnam Historic District of Zanesville, Ohio, with the mission of providing fresh produce and gardening opportunities to residents in a designated "food desert."

As the program has grown, our mission has evolved to focus on "Growing with a Purpose." This initiative allows us to partner with local food pantries, growing food tailored to their specific needs while also educating the community on sustainable gardening practices and the benefits of growing their own food.

At Urban Greens, we believe in the transformative power of fresh, local food and sustainable practices. Over the past two years, our six community gardens have yielded approximately 32,000 pounds of produce, benefiting families in need through food pantries, hot food services and summer school programs. But our impact goes beyond providing food—we equip individuals and communities with the knowledge and skills to grow their own, conserve the environment, and lead healthier lives.

Through educational programs, conservation workshops, and hands-on community events, Urban Greens is making a lasting difference in the lives of those we serve.

We are implementing a Growing in the Garden Education Series for residents of Maple Terrace (a Zanesville Metropolitan Housing Authority Site) located next to the Maple-Harding Garden where residents can reserve raised garden beds for free to grow their own food. We could use the following items to provide these residents with the tools necessary to grow their own food:

hand trowels soil knives

small hoes small bags of soil garden gloves garden scissors

twine small trellises for raised garden beds

(the Bergamo Center is accessible with living quarters, cafeteria, classrooms all on one floor; however, this year two classes will be held in the lower level)


Date: June 27, 2025, Registration begins at 9:30 a.m. – June 29, 2025, Ending at 12:30 p.m.

Our Theme: "Practicing Hope Together"

This theme will explore the hope that emerged within a small community of followers after the resurrection of Jesus that changed the world. Out of so much confusion and fear following the crucifixion of Jesus, grew a "Resurrection People" steeped in hope who began living out their faith in powerful ways.

Adult curriculum – "Practicing Hope" by Tabatha Holley

Practicing Hope is a biblical curriculum that invites us to explore hope as a daily practice. Its purpose is to allow all of our communities to cultivate hope that is honest about our current conditions (refugia), hope that is restorative when everything feels urgent (rest), and hope that is possible even when we transgress (repair).



Youth — Communities of the Spirit: Living into Hope as Resurrection People by Regina Heater

Communities of the Spirit invites youth to consider what they need in a community to help them be committed to actions that transform the world into the kin-dom they anticipate. Youth will explore the inexplicable hope we find in early post-resurrection Christian communities. Heater asks how we can create such "Communities of the Spirit" today by examining common themes found in the post-resurrection stories: bravery, miracles, rituals, time and diversity, the fruit of the Spirit, and adversity and perseverance.

Children — Hope as a Resurrection People by Joni Cisowski Hope as a Resurrection People intends to help children build trust in Jesus to

bring comfort and support as they find courageous hope in the face of uncertainty. Through each session, children will develop their understanding of hope by reflecting on important people, communities, places, activities, personal goals, and desires for the future. Then, they will look for ways to build communal hope to be the change our world needs today.
